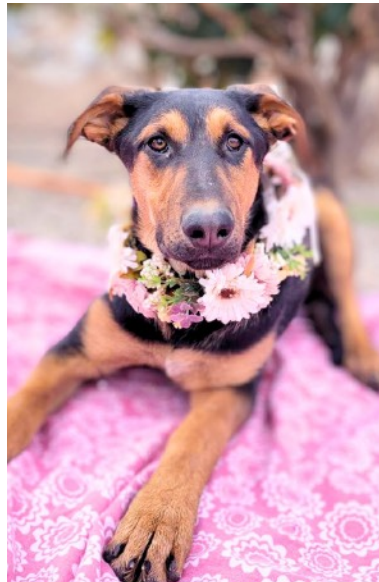

The good news is we have fixed 76 pets in February That is a total of 135 spay/neuters this year.
Our average cost for spay/neuter is \$250.00 each.
So far we have spent \$33,750 this year.

The benefits of CBD oil in dogs

CBD has also been used for Epilepsy, Osteoarthritis and chronic itchy skin due to atopic dermatitis. Furthermore, CBD oil is generally considered safe and well-tolerated, with minimal side effects compared to traditional pharmaceuticals. As the understanding of CBD continues to evolve, many pet owners are turning to this natural alternative, highlighting the importance of consulting with a veterinarian to determine appropriate dosages and formulations for their furry companions.

Researchers at Cornell Veterinary University have been doing extensive studies on CBD and CBDA oil. CBDA is more potent than CBD with a shorter shelf life.

Dr Joseph J. Wakshlag DVM, PHD, Board certified Veterinary nutritionist is the chief researcher at Cornell Veterinary University.

CBD oil, or cannabidiol oil, is a natural extract derived from the cannabis plant. It contains cannabidiol (CBD), a non-psychoactive compound found in both marijuana and hemp.

Properties:

- Non-psychoactive, meaning it does not produce a "high" like THC
- Extracted from the flowers, leaves, or stems of the cannabis plant
- Typically contains less than 0.3% THC, the psychoactive compound in marijuana.
