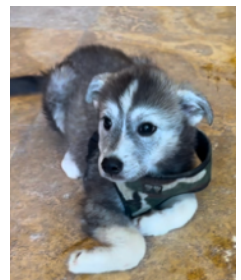
Speaking to the vet, we all decided since she was young that we would take a different approach.

Last year, Hope Ranch provided over 530 spay and neuter procedures in our small community to help address the issue of feral dogs. We reached out to numerous low-income individuals, some of whom were overwhelmed with the number of dogs they were caring for, and offered free spay and neuter services. Often, we had to emphasize the importance of this initiative to encourage their participation.

We believe that our efforts at Hope Ranch are making a real impact on the amount of unwanted dogs in our community.

If half of these dogs were females and they each had 8 puppies, that would have been 2,120 puppies born last year.

Many of these puppies are born in poor living conditions without the proper housing, food and water. Living pens outside that never get cleaned.

While we only charge a small fee for adoptions, our spay and neuter costs have increased. We are committed to continuing our spay and neuter program because we truly believe it is making a difference. We invite you to support this initiative; any contribution, no matter the size, will help us maintain our progress. Let's keep building on this positive momentum!
